About the Series

The **BPS Foundations and Futures of Psychology: New Directions and Global Perspectives Series** offers cutting-edge, international perspectives on high profile topics that are of immediate concern to upper-level students, researchers and the field of psychology more broadly. Featuring both authored and edited books, the series serves as a springboard for upcoming scholars from diverse global backgrounds. Edited books in the series include an international range of perspectives, authored books focus on the latest research, and both volume types intend to push the frontiers of the discipline. Edited books for the series are encouraged to adopt a paired editorship, including an eminent scholar mentoring an early career academic, if appropriate. Each title focusses on a key topic, reviewing where the field has been and providing discursive debate of the latest research and practice. This forward-looking insight will encourage critical understanding of – and reflection on – the events that shape contemporary approaches and future directions in psychology.

Distinctive features of books in the series

- Can be authored or edited.
- If edited, books include contributions from a global writing team, and are encouraged to be edited by an eminent scholar along with an early career academic.
- A coherent and consistent structure across volumes and within chapters but with an emphasis on individual contributors' voices shining through, to offer in-depth context and analysis.
- For relevant topics, vignettes from professionals in the field, illustrating real world context and application of the issues being discussed.
- Companion resources for research supervisors that could include extracts from/summaries of real students' dissertations, demonstrating the kind of research undertaken globally.
- Potential for Open Access titles or chapters.

Aimed at advanced under-graduate and post-graduate students, and researchers in the field, as well as professionals with a keen interest in the latest thinking on issues that inform their practice.

Format and length

- To ensure accessibility, volumes published in hardback, paperback and eBook
- Books will be on average between 70,000-90,000 words (approx. 190-240 pages)

Open Access

Books in the series can publish in the traditional way (in hardback, paperback and eBook formats) or as [Open Access](#) publications. If the book is Open Access, the eBook will be made freely available to download as a DRM-free PDF on the Taylor & Francis eBooks platform. A free eBook will be available from commercial distributors such as Amazon. For customers wanting a hard copy of the book, a print version will also be available for purchase and royalties will still be payable on any print version.

Routledge's Open Access books are discoverable via key search engines such as Google Scholar and we will also deposit a copy in the OAPEN (Open Access Publishing in European Networks) online library. Research suggests that OA content is far more likely to be downloaded and cited than non-OA content. A variety of CC licence types are available.
