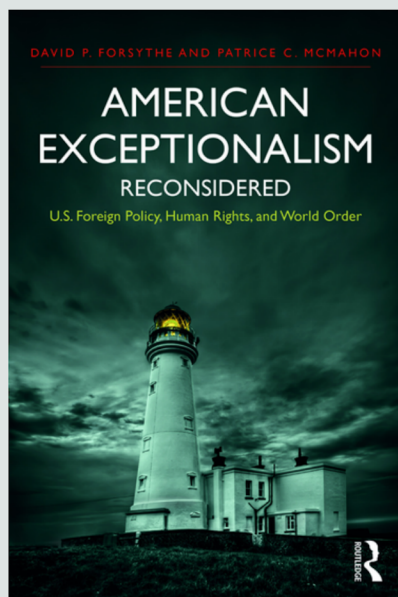

ISI books offer an intensive introduction to subjects often left out of the curriculum.

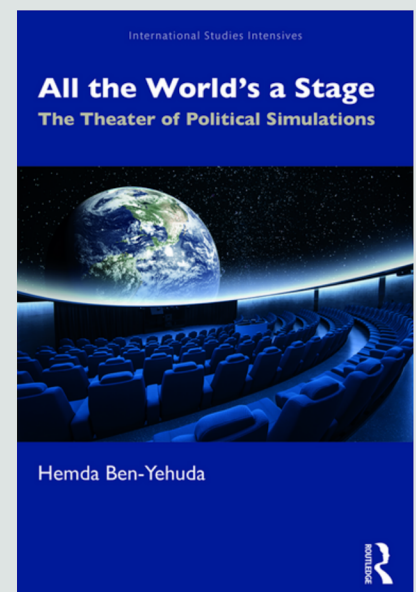
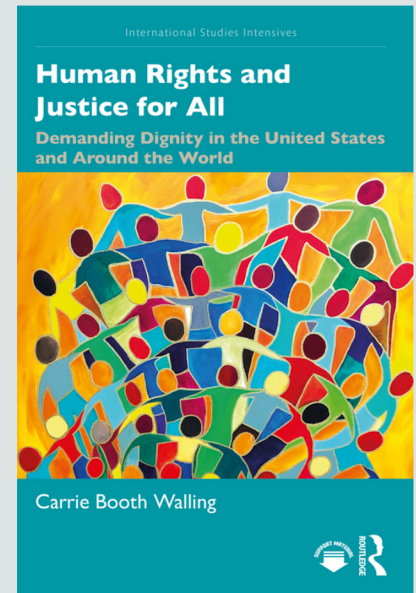


Every ISI book packs a wealth of information into a small space and does so in ways that students find compelling, and instructors find useful.

STATEMENT OF AIMS

BLURB AND KEYWORDS

Please write a brief blurb (approx. 250 words) and provide 5-10 keywords for your book.

DEFINITION OF THE MARKET

Who is your book primarily aimed at? What courses would the book be used on?

TABLE OF CONTENTS AND CHAPTER ABSTRACTS

Please provide a simple table of contents and one paragraph of explanation of each chapter

COMPETING OR RELATED TITLES

What are the main competing or related books and what makes your book better?

LENGTH AND SCHEDULE

When will you be able to deliver the completed typescript? How many words will it be? (Books in the series are 60-75,000 words) How many tables and figures will there be?

AUTHOR BIOGRAPHY

Please provide your full name, current affiliation and a brief biography.
