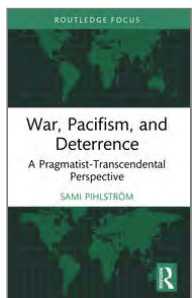
As a moral phenomenon, promises have long received attention in debates within both normative ethics and metaethics. This book defends a novel trust-based form of non-reductivism about promises and promissory normativity. This view retains the intuitive plausibility of a non-reductive account of promissory normativity, according to which the mere fact that one has validly promised is sufficient to render a breach of promise morally wrong. At the same time, it also provides a powerful and theoretically appealing value-based explanation of our promissory power, a type of explanation traditionally thought to be limited only to reductive accounts of promissory normativity.
